DIRECTOR'S OVERVIEW

“Uthando goes beyond tourism, they care”

If you reading this report, let me thank you from the very core of my heart for being part of our journey, especially over the last year. Let me also apologise in advance for the length of this report, but considering we work with so many amazing community projects, and have the privilege of connecting them to so many kind people around the world, it is a very tough task keeping this report to just a couple of pages.

Uthando is an organisation linking tourism with community development projects. Despite a collapse of tourism in March 2020, thanks to our thoughtful and generous family of friends from South Africa and all around the world, Uthando was able to help and support thousands of people and distribute just under R5 million to more than 60 community development projects which are working tirelessly on the ground to alleviate hunger, poverty and suffering caused by the Covid-19 crisis and subsequent lockdown.

Truthfully, South Africa was already in a pretty dire situation before Covid-19 with record unemployment and stagnation permeating all aspects of life in the country.

Uthando is a tiny organisation but we have a big heart, dedication to our beliefs and philosophy, and a deep conviction to play our modest but impactful part in re-imagining our beautiful country.

I often get overwhelmed with emotion at the scale of poverty and inequality in South Africa. I struggle to traverse the two worlds in which I find myself, or infact the two universes which inhabit the country. I struggle with existential questions around the human civilization that we have built and my place in it. Running Uthando helps me to process what is going on in the world and to be present each day by striving to be part of the solution, whatever that might be.

I am honestly just beyond grateful for the people that believe in our work and support our modest efforts to build our nation through grass roots community projects and activism. THANK YOU.

Team Uthando had no lockdown at all. We literally worked day and night to generate money and other forms of assistance to support community projects on the ground. Our “Uthando Vehicle” transformed from carrying guests on tours into a true work horse, carrying food and basic supplies to distressed communities.

The information age brings with it huge challenges, like having to constantly reflect the work being done on social media platforms which is hugely time consuming, creating enormous amounts of additional work. But, the flip side of the coin to social media is the ability to convey a message to a global audience instantaneously. I have no doubt at all, that social media enabled Uthando to convey our message and activities which in turn generated heartfelt support for our emergency relief efforts.

I am very sure there are few 2021 annual reports that will not lament the stresses, strain's and trauma's of recent global events. The year since 1 April 2020 has been dramatic, historic and unprecedented in scope and impact on humanity.

The commencement of Uthando's annual financial year on 1 April 2020 pretty much coincided with the dramatic unfolding of the Covid-19 crisis and subsequent lockdowns. Virtually every human being on the planet has had to deal with death, loss, fear and profound uncertainty since the commencement of the crisis.

As I draft this report I am actually visualizing the individuals who were and still are connected to Uthando (Love) South Africa, human beings who have formed part of the Uthando Family over the last year and infact for many years. This exercise fills with my heart with great joy and gratitude. I thank each and every one of you for your love, support and hard work to help create a better, more just and equal state of humanity.

We are deeply grateful for the fact that Uthando had the infrastructure, the relationships, the experience and the ability to almost immediately adapt to the fast-changing circumstances created by the pandemic, harnessing the power of our tried and tested bridge between tourism and community development, thus providing life-saving assistance and support to a broad range of community development initiatives located across the width and breadth of Cape Town.

We are profoundly grateful for the kind and generous people from South Africa and every corner of the world who rallied to support Uthando's emergency relief assistance being provided by our community development partners on the ground.

Last but certainly not least, we are grateful for the passionate, dedicated, tenacious, visionary and selfless community development activists who mobilized their communities to provide life-saving support to millions of South Africans left destitute and vulnerable by the strict lockdowns imposed by the government.

I have no doubt at all that the President of South Africa, Cyril Ramaphosa had the best of intentions when announcing the sweeping measures of assistance to support vulnerable communities impacted by the lockdowns, but sadly government beaurocracy and in some cases corruption, meant that this support did not always reach the beneficiaries quick enough. The non profit sector and civil society really stepped up to fill the vacuum, and I am proud that Uthando was able to play its part in poverty alleviation efforts in the City of Cape Town.

We believe that through our consistent and constant messaging and reflecting the many stories of courage, hope and resilience through our monthly newsletters and social media platforms, Uthando also provided our followers and supporters with hope, inspiration and a vision of kindness and love at a time when people throughout the world really needed it.

Thank you to the Uthando Board for providing the support for “Team Uthando” to flourish, and to my colleague Xolani Maseko for his dedication and passion to our vision and working tirelessly to fulfill our mission and purpose. Thank you also to our friend and colleague Quiesto Spieringshoek for the professional messaging being conveyed on our social media platforms.

Once the shock and trauma of the unfolding Covid-19 crisis and subsequent hard lockdown had subsided, the Uthando Team swung into action. First we had to accept that our usual programme of action of taking visitors to the community development projects was indefinitely terminated.

The visits to the community projects is how Uthando shines a light on the incredible work of these programmes to the world. It is through these visits that Uthando is able to show visitors just how inspiring, innovative and courageous these South African activists actually are, and through this process we inspire people to support these programmes financially and in other ways.

"KMA is a music school but in reality we offer refuge, trauma healing, care, decent nutrition and psychological support to our students and their families".

As the crisis was unfolding Uthando identified the community development projects that were putting initiatives into place to provide food, shelter, blankets and other forms of emergency support as South Africa was approaching an awful uncertain winter.

In the last two weeks of March 2020 Uthando provided the finances to urban micro farming operations with a view to ensuring that come winter there would be massive harvests of healthy, organic vegetables to some of the most vulnerable communities. This investment paid off generously with huge crops of fresh, organic winter vegetables harvested and delivered to people that needed it most.

It is quite difficult to reflect the impact that Uthando assistance provided for each project, because in some instances Uthando was part of a broader base of donors whilst in other cases Uthando was basically the sole contributor to the grass roots programmes.

Some of the community projects are really multi-focused offering various forms of support, thus it is quite difficult to provide an overview in a linear format.

Most community projects swung into emergency mode and deviated substantially from their core programmes towards emergency relief, for example, Dwyn Griesel from Kronendal Music Academy (KMA) explained during the crisis,

For example, vegetables were grown by Ludwe Qamata (Ghetto Gardener) at the Sinovuyo Seniors Centre and when winter arrived, every week fresh, healthy vegetables were delivered to the seniors who were isolating in their respective homes.

“Uthando’s support to the Siyazama Garden has been ongoing since 2009 and continues to this day. 2020 started out promising for the micro-farmers at Siyazama with the re-introduction of the youth training and apprenticeship program, providing training and practical agricultural skills to the youth and establishment of a new market to sell their produce, definitely it was a promising and exciting year. All of which had to be abruptly stopped due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which was a devastating blow to the farmers.

Siyazama had to quickly adapt and be amongst the organizations in the forefront of food security and provision of healthy food to vulnerable communities. The garden mass produced a variety of vegetables such as spinach, spring onion, beetroot, cabbage and carrots for distribution and bought grocery food parcels weekly for very vulnerable 15 families.

The donations received from Uthando enabled us to help our community through this difficult time. The ongoing weekly support from Uthando enables us to buy garden tools, a vegetable scale, manure and compost, seedlings and seeds. The help and support given by Uthando and donors is valued and appreciated because without it the situation would have been extremely terrible for many people in their community.”

Schools Environmental Education and Development (SEED) – Mitchells Plain

“SEED is deeply grateful to Uthando for their unwavering support through the crazy year that was 2020. Food poverty in Mitchells Plain was 36% before lockdown and rose alarmingly to 52% as the year progressed and job losses took their toll. Uthando support enabled us to pivot our gardens to support two local feeding schemes - regularly feeding 677 people.”

SEED launched the feeding scheme gardens in April 2020 and have produced 1,55 tons of fresh organic produce to date. This was supplemented with 8266 naan breads, which we baked weekly at SEED. This has had a huge impact on the alleviation of hunger in Mitchells Plain and is proof of what a few committed people can do when they work together.”

The Uthando Team was deeply traumatized at the thought of how many of the community projects relied on tourism for their income and what would happen to them. The musicians, choirs, poets, artists and entrepreneurs who lost their income almost overnight. Basically within a few days the tourism industry ground to halt. Hotels and tourist sites were closed. Places like Waterfront where the choirs also performed and generated their income closed overnight. How were they going to survive this financial apocalypse we wondered. The uncertainty was terrifying.

The South African Government announced sweeping measures of support for people impacted by the crisis, but we all knew that this would be slow and bogged down by bureaucracy.

Thanks to our donors, Uthando was able to provide a lifeline to these truly remarkable people doing important work in the development of their respective communities.

DIRECT SUPPORT TO DESTITUTE FAMILIES THROUGH OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Many people living in materially impoverished communities had little to no line of defence against hunger, access to basic services like electricity and mobile data enabling them to maintain communication. Their income vanished overnight. Many families in SA survive on income generated from hand-to-mouth. No work, no income, so with the lockdown many people were deprived of the opportunity to support their families.

Uthando stepped in to assist several organisations that made direct financial payments to families that they identified as extremely vulnerable and destitute.

Christel House School

We are extremely grateful for the generous support received from Uthando SA. All Christel House students come from severely impoverished homes on the Cape Flats, where the average household income is less than R1,500 per person per month. Uthando SA's funding helped to provide a critical lifeline to our 1000+ students and their families by providing food and basic necessities throughout the lockdown. The gratitude from our students and parents continue to stream in as we adapt to the new normal in 2021.

As a non-profit no-fee school that serves close to 1000 students from the Cape Flats, Christel House provides a host of critical services as part of our holistic education model – from daily nutrition to healthcare and social services. When schools were instructed to close at the end of March 2020, we had a robust strategy in place to ensure that our children had access to sufficient educational resources, health and food supplies, and social support. A key part of our plan was ensuring food security for our students and their families. In addition to distributing regular food parcels to our students, we also identified 300 of our most at-risk families and supported them with monthly stipends for 6 months through eWallet payments.

On the education front, we launched an ambitious remote learning curriculum. In our Junior School, students received printed workbooks and we setup parent WhatsApp groups so teachers can relay educational instructions on how to complete their daily tasks. In our High School, we supplied donated tablets and data to our students to allow them to attend online classes via Zoom. This new innovative way of teaching was not without its challenges, but in total we only missed three academic days in 2020 and continue to make use of online teaching methods in 2021. One stand-out testament to our success is the fact that our Matric Class of 2020 achieved a 100% pass rate and an 80.5% bachelor's pass.

Non-profit school raises funds to feed poor families

DONATIONS from around the world have raised enough money for Ottery-based non-profit school Christel House to feed more than 250 families until the end of July.

Christel House serves 1000 pupils from 20 impoverished communities on the Cape Flats.

At the start of last month, the school started a fund-raising campaign called "Help a family in crisis during lockdown" to provide food for 166 of its most vulnerable families during the lockdown.

The plan was to provide weekly stipends to these households for eight weeks so they could buy basic food supplies and other necessities. The public's response to the

PIONEERING INTO DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES

The Big Issue

“Uthando has helped Big Issue NGO manage the Covid storm which saw vendors sales decline for more than a year now. Uthando has, together with other funder supporters, help us provide a monthly Covid grant of R100 per month for 3 months during the first national lockdown in 2020. With those funds, we could also provide masks, pocket-size hand sanitisers and plastic bags for the magazines. For winter this year, we purchased a Family Size Food Parcel for each vendor. And then there is the little issue magazine which helps vendors sell a second product on the street.”

As a way of thanking Uthando for supporting the vendors, the Big Issue magazine has gifted free prime advertising space in the magazine to Uthando



DIRECT SUPPORT TO DESTITUTE FAMILIES THROUGH OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Many people living in materially impoverished communities had little to no line of defence against hunger, access to basic services like electricity and mobile data enabling them to maintain communication. Their income vanished overnight. Many families in SA survive on income generated from hand-to-mouth. No work, no income, so with the lockdown many people were deprived of the opportunity to support their families.

Uthando stepped in to assist several organisations that made direct financial payments to families that they identified as extremely vulnerable and destitute.

This serves as a safe space for our youth. James Fernie and the Uthando SA team, marketed our organisation and through this, we were able to grow exponentially and support more communities and CBOs in Hanover Park and informal settlements. In December 2020, we were able to host a camp for 30 youth who all received toiletry and goodie bags. We are extremely appreciative of the support that Uthando SA has granted us. “The Cart Horse Protection Association has been helping working horses on the Cape Flats for 26 years. We have built strong relationships with horse owners and can proudly say that CHPA is the first call they make when they have a problem. As South Africans banded together to flatten the curve of the spread of COVID-19, animal welfare organisations faced all their usual problems and then some!

With the entire country in lockdown and all movement restricted, contingency plans were put in place so that owners could get medication for horses should they need it. Our Field staff stayed in touch 24/7 telephonically. Cart horse owners who live from hand to mouth were unable to earn an income, thus unable to stockpile food for themselves or feed for the horses. When owners cannot work, horses cannot be fed and we did not want to see an increase in under-condition horses on the road when allowed to go back to work. With the help of Uthando and their incredible donors, no horse went hungry during lockdown as our feed appeal helped us hand out feed to everyone.

Masi Creative Hub - Masiphumelele

Masiphumelele Township in Fish Hoek has an estimated population of more than 50 000 people, some being foreign nationals from countries such as Zimbabwe and Malawi with the unemployment rate estimated at 70%. It is difficult to find a way out of poverty and many lack the mind-set needed to do so. Masi-Creative Hub is part of the solution; we provide programs that seek to help, empower and integrate the community. With the funding received from Uthando, the Masi-Creative kitchen has been able to cook and distribute meals to more than 1000 people, mostly children daily at their 7 feeding stations and bought 6 new big pots, bought art equipment and material for 30 students in their art program, garden tools, seedlings and manure acquired, and bought 4 sewing machines and an overlocker for the women's craft program. A major contributor to South Africa’s hunger crisis is the economic downturn and loss of income as a result of Covid-19, yet food prices continue to rise. South Africa’s hunger crisis, fuelled by poverty and unemployment, has long existed, predating the Covid-19 pandemic. According to the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification analysis report, from January to March 2021, 11.8 million people in South Africa were classified as being at IPC Phase 3, which means their level of hunger is at crisis level. The Amy Foundation was able to see that first-hand as the queues for food increased daily and at the height of winter snaked around the entire block, where men, women and children waited in the cold and wet for a hot meal to take home, for many the only hot meal that they would have for that day.

It is utterly heart-breaking. The feeding scheme started out with a target of 350 meals per day and grew rapidly to the point that we were feeding up to 900 people per site per day and we ran two feeding schemes in Gugulethu and Bonteheuwel where our after school programmes run. The community leaders and members could not thank us enough for all that we were trying to do. At times the situation felt hopeless with funding being reduced, but we could always count on Uthando to assist where they could and for that we will always be thankful! James and Xolani – you embody the meaning of Ubuntu! Thank you for being such a positive force when we needed you the most. “



Kensington Place rallies to provide emergency food to the community of Hanover Park

Thank you to Chris Weir for reaching out to Uthando as a partner in this awesome and worthy project.

This story is far more than just about food, it is about community and nation building, bringing together several tourism companies and community partners to alleviate hunger in Hanover Park - a mixed race community in Cape Town ravaged by gangsterism, drugs and poverty. It is also an amazing example of tourism companies collaborating with common purpose for good. Since the middle of May, the Kensington Place Hotel team and friends led by Chris Weir and Richard Butt, together with the Black Sheep Restaurant Team, cooked more than 55 000 hot, delicious and nutritious meals. These meals are then transported daily from the city bowl by Rory Goldhill (Global Elite Touring) Stephen Stockdale & Leroy Glam from the YMCA Cape Town to Hanover Park which is then graciously handed out to residents in need by Uthando's two community partners on the ground, The Alcardo Andrews Foundation team led by Aunty Avril Andrews and the Hanover Park Cricket Club guys led by Peter Roberts and Wesley Seconds.

Chris Weir sent the following message to Uthando :

"It was during the hard and inconceivable lockdown that I realized there were so many who are less fortunate and had nothing to eat. Reflecting on our privilege, I decided to take the Kensington Place kitchen and rope some of my friends in to starting a food initiative; where we provide healthy, nutritious food the less fortunate. We partnered with Uthando to assist us with distributing the food – James was able to locate a community who are desperate and in need, and with that we raised generous donations from wonderful clients, tour operators and friends for the ingredients and varying costs. We are now sitting at 25 000 meals provided to Hanover Park community within the last 10 weeks. We hope we can continue for a few more months until this plight is over."

“UBUNTU BEANIES” Project by Maria Ross

Maria Ross (Team leader of Leisure Travel, from Terra Nova Tours in Cape Town), contacted Uthando in June 2020 with a beautiful and inspiring initiative. Knitting began as a hobby for Maria, in 2019, as she taught herself to knit beanies. People soon wanted to purchase the beanies, and so with an incentive to support at-risk communities, UBUNTU BEANIES was established. Instead of giving the knitted beanies away as gifts for free, Maria would ask each recipient to remember our exchange in life, and pay for the beanie by making a donation to Brave Rock Girl, through Uthando.



Maria selected the word “Ubuntu” because of its meaning - “I am because we are, or humanity towards others”. Maria had the idea that every little bit of support helps, and the purpose of the beanie project is to live the meaning of Ubuntu. UBUNTU BEANIES are not specifically priced (aside from the sponsored beanies), as Maria would prefer each person to decide for themselves, as to how much they are able to afford and donate.

When approaching Uthando with her concept, Maria wrote the following:

“Howzit! My name is Maria Ross, I live in Cape Town and I started the ubuntu.beanies project in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic in April 2020.

What is this all about? I knit beanies for a good cause. Each beanie is unique and individually tailored to your needs. You decide the price you want to pay for your handknitted beanie (plus courier fees). With the proceeds I not only finance the production of beanies, I also support a soup kitchen and a socially sustainable girls’ project in the townships of Cape Town.

With the Sponsor-a-beanie initiative, you pay a fixed price that supports the above projects and donate your self-designed beanie to a senior club in Khayelitsha.

The projects: Uthando (means “Love”) is a non-profit organization that collects donations for community development projects in Cape Town’s townships. In addition to supporting the Sinovuyo Seniors Club to which the beanies of the Sponsor-a-beanie campaign go, proceeds also go through Uthando to a project called Brave Rock Girls, a girl-led project in Khayelitsha that provides girls at risk with access to education, health care and safety. Soup-a-heroes by Drifter Brewery is the third project supported by ubuntu.beanies. After the alcohol ban in South Africa due to the pandemic from March 2020 onwards, restaurants and local micro-breweries had to rethink and started using their huge brew kettles for other purposes. Since then, Drifter has been heavily involved in the production of soups, which are delivered to NGOs in Cape Town’s townships. The Drifter Brewing Company has fed more than 250,000 people in ten different communities in Cape Town and continues to use parts of the brewery for these purposes even after the ban on alcohol came to an end.

The Uthando Team had no lockdown at all, and in fact worked even harder than before and often under considerable stress. The whole experience of working and travelling during level 5 lockdown will forever remain a surreal memory, empty streets devoid of cars and people, long lines of people at shops waiting to obtain basics. Working during this time was extremely frustrating as people were working at home or companies, banks, institutions closed. Everything took much much longer to complete or finalise.

For example. The SA government offered financial relief to people in various industries including tourism, unemployment benefits or TERS. It was an administrative nightmare trying to obtain these payments for the Uthando staff, in fact it took months of jumping through many admin hoops to finally obtain this funding from the government. This was in addition to running Uthando and delivering on how promises to community projects and donors.

I was invited to speak at the launch of the brand new kitchen for the Alcardo Andrews Foundation on 3 December 2020 in Hanover Park. It was a profound honour for me to be present in Hanover Park with a group of amazing people. As a conclusion to this report, I would like to share my speech, which I feel is relevant to the months and years ahead which we will face together, collectively, as a human race.



Before I start today, I would like to ask for a minutes silence for all of the women, children, members of the LGBTQ community and all people who have died or suffered as a result of gang violence, Gender Based Violence, discrimination and bigotry, in Hanover Park, the Cape Flats and South Africa.

Aunty Avril, Kadar and Clayton (The Andrews Family), thank you for welcoming us into your home and the official base for the Alcardo Andrews Foundation today.

To the whole team of "Moms Move For Justice" and the Alcardo Andrews Foundation, Aunty Avril, Lesley and all of the MOMS, thank you for hosting us today on this very special occasion.

I don't normally write down my speeches and prefer to speak from the heart and off the cuff. However, I wish to share this speech with the many people who are not able to attend this function today, as I wish to extend heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to them, and for them to read my message to the people of Hanover Park.

It is an honour and a privilege to be present with you today, at the launch of this beautiful space and the brand new kitchen in Hanover Park. Infact, for me personally it also a dream turned into a beautiful reality.

I have been Chairperson of the Harfield Village Association (HVA) for almost 10 years. For several years I have implored our committee to reach out and extend a hand of friendship to our neighbours in Hanover Park with a view to breaking down barriers and mutual co-operation. I have said it many times, but Hanover Park is a mere 10 minutes geographically from Harfield Village but might as well be on a different planet in terms of the living conditions for the residents in their respective communities. Here we are today with our beautiful friends in Hanover Park, building bridges, bringing people together and celebrating all that is good about the humanity, forging the kind of society that could be so achievable in South Africa if we all worked together with common purpose and a shared vision for real justice and equality.

There is a saying that every cloud has a silver lining which in reality means that we should always look for the opportunity in adversity. When I look at the people of the Cape Flats I am strike by their tenacity, their resilience, their kindness and generosity, their warmth and welcoming spirit and of course their graciousness.

I am acutely aware this saying is infact a way of life for YOU, finding the goodness and opportunity inspite of the absolutely enormous challenges and adversity which you face almost on a daily basis, the type of challenges and adversity that people in areas like Harfield Village and suburban Cape Town simply cannot begin to comprehend.

Avril, Kadar and Clayton, of course I never met your son and brother, Alcardo, who was shot multiple times right here on this corner on the 28th of October 2015 and succumbed to his injuries. Honestly I cannot begin to imagine the kind of trauma that you as a family have had to endure since that fateful date. Lesley and Jeremy, the same applies to you with the senseless murder of your son Rory. Infact for all the MOMS, DADS and FAMILIES here today whose children have been murdered through gang violence or violence in general, you have my deepest and most sincere respect and admiration for turning tragedy into triumph and opportunity. Opportunity to be part of the solution, opportunity to heal your own wounds but also heal the deep wounds of a deeply scarred community. Scarred through no fault of your own making, but through hundreds of years of oppression, discrimination, forced removals and an evil consciousness perpetrated upon you that that said you were the "lesser people" in the country of your birth.

Through my work with Uthando over the last years 12 years, I have had the privilege of meeting so many truly outstanding and remarkable individuals, people that have turned terrible tragedy into triumph of the human spirit, and through their courage have honoured the legacy of their lost family member, helping thousands of people and provided a bright light of hope and inspiration.

Linda and Peter Biehl lost their only daughter Amy Biehl who was killed by a violent politically motivated mob in Gugulethu on the 25th of August 1993 and went on to form the Amy Biehl Foundation. Over the course of more than 20 years the foundation has provided an opportunity for literally many thousands of children to attend after-school programmes and obtain skills to equip them for transformation and development in their lives.

The Kaimowitz Family lost their 20 year old daughter, Ashley who was killed instantly by a drunk driver in March 2005. After meeting Mama Nocawe Mankayi in her tiny little home in Khayelitsha which also functioned as a place of safety for women and children, and after actually bearing witness to a little child being brought into her home after being raped, young Ashley produced a short documentary on the horrors of sexual and violent abuse of women and children in Khayelitsha. Before she died, Ashley used that video to raise awareness and funds to build a decent centre for abused women and children in Khayelitsha. After Ashley's death, the Kaimowitz Family and especially her father Jeffrey, took up where Ashley left off to fulfill her vision of supporting the true angel of mercy Mama Nocawe in establishing a decent centre for absued women and children. Today, Mama Nocawe and Jeffrey are part of a passionate team of people managing the world class Nonceba (meaning "Concern") Family Counselling Centre in Khayelitsha which was opened in November 2008.

To the Andrews and Wyngaard Families, and all of the "Moms Move for Justice", today we honour your stories, your journeys, and we commit to supporting and helping your initiatives wherever and however we can.

2020 has been an unforgettable year. For as long as I live I will not forget the intensity of the experience that we all shared together during the covid 19 lockdown. Our first meeting at Rosmead Central Primary School where we stood in a huge circle, breaking the ice with introductions, getting to know each other and giving our input and ideas for the programme of action for the uncertain times ahead...the HVA "helping angels team", the Alcardo Andrews team and the Hanover Park Cricket Club team.

CONCLUSION

Our constant communication, sorting lists of groceries, driving on apocalyptic deserted roads with a vehicle packed with groceries and other basic necessities, and of course driving into Hanover Park for the first time overcoming the fear of gangs and violence. Driving into this space out of fear that starving and desperate people would attack the vehicle like in other communities around Cape Town. The five "Saturday Sandwiches Drives" which turned into quite festive affairs but with more than 15 000 sandwiches lovingly made and delivered to the resident of Hanover Park. There was no lockdown because there was important work to be done! to Aunty Avril for surviving several weeks in hospital and the very tragic passing of our dear friend and comrade Peter Roberts due to Covid 19.

THANK YOU Aunty Avril, Lesley, all of the MOMS for JUSTICE and your families for your love, kindness, courage, tenacity and your programme of action in Hanover Park.

THANK YOU to Ashraf, Wes, our dear late friend Peter, Adam and the Hanover Park Cricket Club for your truly heroic efforts to help this community during these troubled times.

THANK YOU to all of the other community projects like Girls Matter, and others driven by innovative leadership. THANK YOU to the Harfield Village "Helping Angels team, Alison, Maggie, Terry, Anel, Reyhana, Leila and Delva" as well as each and every person and company that contributed to the "Campaign of Goodness" run the Harfield Village Association.

THANK YOU to Chris Weir, Richard Butt, Kensington Place and the entire "Empty Bellies" team for the massive effort of cooking 55 000 hot and nutritious meals during lockdown and for initiating and driving this fulltime kitchen initiative in Hanover Park.

THANK YOU to Rory, Stephen and Leroy for collecting and delivering the food from town and driving out to Hanover Park every day, Monday to Friday. It was quite a logistical operation.

THANK YOU to the dedicated team who then distributed the food every evening throughout Hanover Park during the cold, wet and dark winter months. This is going to sound like a typical white South African thing to say, but on the odd occasion that I accompanied Aunty Avril and the team with food distribution, I had to pinch myself that I was deep in Hanover Park. These communities are so demonized in the press with high levels of gangsterism and violence, it is difficult not to be extremely fearful of coming into Hanover Park.

THANK YOU to Maggie Palthe for conceptualizing the beautiful initiative to generate funds for Hanover Park, the bags and tea towels "My Name is Hope, My Name is Peace and My Name is Happiness" and The Rosmead Super Spar for funding the initiative and paying over the profits in advance.

THANK YOU to the new friends and supporters of the foundation, the new kitchen and Hanover Park in general, namely Brigitte Walsh, Travel Beyond (Sweden), African Portfolio (USA) Jacana Travel (Germany) Young Ashley Kaimowitz's words are so beautiful and an appropriate way to end of this talk , "One can change the world if you have a heart without fear, a mind without walls and a dream big enough to share. All the best Aunty Avril and your amazing team, we stand ready to support you.
